College representatives from Disability Resource Centers and Admissions offices will provide a presentation about the transition to college for students needing accommodations and services at college. Nov 16th @ 6:30 – Guardianship, Power of Attorney, Special Needs Trusts at Schalmont HS – are you concerned about your child's ability to care for her/himself, and to make medical and financial decisions on their own behalf once they turn 18? Do you know the difference between guardianship and a power of attorney and what you can/can't do with both? Join us to learn about the legal tools available to you and your child so you can be as prepared and protected as possible once he/she reaches the age of majority.
