2018 School Budget Vote Exit Survey Report

Introduction

The Guilderland Central School District conducted an exit survey during its Annual School Budget Vote on May 15, 2018. The purpose was to collect demographic data about who voted on the budget and information about why voters voted the way they did.

The survey was voluntary and anonymous. Surveys were made available, both electronically and in paper form, to voters at the polling sites for anyone who chose to fill one out after voting. While these results do not represent the opinions of all voters, they do provide many residents' perceptions about the district and its proposed budget.

The following data was compiled by the Capital Region BOCES Communications Service in cooperation with the BOCES public information specialist assigned to Guilderland, Aubree Kammler.


Please note: Percentages, where provided, are out of the number of survey participants who responded to that particular question, and not out of the total number of survey participants. For some questions, total percentages may add up to more than 100% because participants were able to select more than one answer choice or as a result of rounding to the nearest whole number.

Guilderland voter turnout and survey participation


In 2018, 1,972 residents voted on Guilderland's school budget. This was a decrease of 25% from 2017.

Of the 1,972 residents who voted, 641 chose to fill out an exit survey—a response rate of 33%. This response rate is the highest in Guilderland since 2014. Of the 641 completed surveys, 378—or 59%—were completed online.



Polling locations

Of the 638 survey respondents who indicated their polling location, more voters (160) completed an exit survey at Westmere Elementary School polling location than at any other polling location (25%). Another 146 respondents completed a survey at Lynnwood Elementary School (23%), and 126 voters completed an exit survey at Guilderland Elementary School (20%). These results continue a trend that started in 2014 that saw survey participation across the five polling locations more evenly distributed than it had been in years past.



Who voted in Guilderland's annual budget vote?


Voters by age group

The chart, right, shows the distribution of survey respondents by age group over the past three years. In 2018, the proportion of survey respondents age 65 and older increased by 4 percentage points from 2017.

The proportion of those age 31-50 decreased 4 percentage points from 2017.

The proportion of survey respondents ages 18-30 increased by 1 percentage point, making it 6%. The proportion of those age 51-64 has been a steady number for the past three years. 59 percent of survey respondents are 51 and older.

Town and length of residency

Town of Guilderland residents were the majority of voters participating in the exit survey at 93% of respondents. Bethlehem residents constituted 6% of survey participants in 2018. Fewer than 1% of survey participants said they live in New Scotland (4 respondents) or the Town of Knox (2 respondents).

More than half (52%) of survey respondents said they have been district residents for more than 20 years. Another 22% said they have lived in the district between 11 and 20 years, and 26% said they've been residents for 10 years or less.

Parent and non-parent voters

As has been the case since 2009, people *without* children currently attending Guilderland schools were the majority of survey participants. In 2018, they represented 64% of respondents, which is a 4% increase from 2017.

Of these respondents, 67% said their children attended Guilderland schools in the past. About 42% indicated they have children who will attend Guilderland schools in the future. This is higher than past years, with 28% in 2017, 34% in 2016 and 35% in 2015.

Respondents with children currently attending Guilderland schools, 36% of all participants in 2018, indicated the following enrollment distribution:

This data shows that the proportion of survey respondents with children attending district elementary schools decreased in 2018 but those with children in middle school has stayed consistent throughout the years. Parents with children in high school had an increased participation rate in the survey by 10 percentage points this year.

Typical voting habits

As in previous years, a significant majority of survey respondents (85%) said they typically vote "yes" on the budget. About 10% said they typically vote "no," and only 5% said they have not voted in the past. All percentages are consistent with results from previous exit surveys.

District and non-district employees

Of the 634 respondents who answered this question, 91% said they were not employed by the school district. This is consistent with previous years. The total number of survey respondents (54) who said they are employed by the district decreased by 12 individuals in 2018 compared with 2017.

Online survey participation in the budget development process.


In 2018, for the third consecutive year, survey respondents were asked whether they participated in district online surveys used during the budget development process.

Of the 615 respondents who answered the question, 22% said they did participate in the budget development surveys, which is consistent with the 22% from 2017. Of those, 90% voted "yes" on the budget, compared with an 83% approval rate among those who did not participate in the online surveys.

How did Guilderland residents vote?

Of the 641 voters who completed an exit survey in 2018, 19 did not indicate how they voted on the budget. Of those that did, 520 said they voted "yes" on the budget, while 102 said they voted "no." This represents a margin of 84% in favor and 16% opposed.

The actual approval rate of the budget was 71%—a difference of 13 percentage points—meaning that a higher percentage of "yes" voters completed an exit survey than did "no" voters. In our experience, this is not uncommon with school budget vote exit surveys. Since 2013, the difference between the actual approval rate and the survey approval rate has been 10 percentage points or more each year.



Budget approval rates among different voter categories

Budget approval rates among survey respondents were similar across all five polling sites, ranging from 89% at Pine Bush Elementary to 86% at Westmere Elementary and 79% at Lynwood Elementary.

As was the case in each of the last four years, the majority of survey respondents living in Guilderland approved the budget (84%). Of the three voters in New Scotland, two voted "yes" on the budget. In Knox, both voters who completed the survey voted "no" on the budget.

Among the survey respondents, a majority approved the budget in 2018 regardless of age or longetivity as a district resident.

Regardless of longevity as a district resident, a majority of respondents approved the budget. As was the case in 2016, the approval rate did not decline as length of residency increased in 2017; rather, the lowest approval rate was among those who have lived in the district 11-20 years (80%).

Respondents with children currently enrolled in Guilderland schools approved the budget at a higher rate than those without children currently attending. However, the approval rates of both sets of respondents dropped in 2018 in both categories, as illustrated below.

For respondents with children in grades K-5 and 9-12 the approval rate dropped by 5 percentage points. For respondents with children in grades 6-8 the approval rates increased by 6 percentage points.

Among respondents without children currently attending district schools, data shows that those who said their children will enroll at Guilderland schools in the future approved the budget at a higher rate than other groups, as indicated below.

Bus and equipment purchase proposition

The actual approval rate for this year's bus and equipment purchase proposition was 72%. A total of 1,963 votes were cast on the proposition, which is 9 votes fewer than were cast on the budget.

As with the budget vote, the approval rate for this proposition was higher among exit survey participants (84%) than among actual voters.

Nearly 96% of those who approved the bus and equipment proposition voted "yes" on the budget, while 24% of those who voted against the proposition supported the budget.

This year, 95% of respondents who said they typically vote "yes" approved the 2018 budget proposal, the same percentage as in 2017 and 2016. Meanwhile, 89% of those who said they typically vote "no" voted against the budget. Of those who said they were voting for the first time 77% of those respondents voted in favor of the budget.

Among 53 respondents who indicated they are district employees, all but 2 voted "yes" on the budget. The approval rate was 82% among those respondents who said they are not district employees.

Why do voters vote the way they do?

The following, in descending order, are the reasons given by the "yes" respondents for approving the budget:

I support investing in education	.87%
I am pleased with the quality of education	69%
The budget meets the needs of our students	67%
The spending/tax increase is reasonable	54%
I have children/grandchildren in the schools	36%

The following, in descending order, are the reasons given by the "no" respondents for voting against the budget:

The spending/tax increase is not reasonable	64%
I support education, but can't afford the cost	45%
I do not have children/grandchildren in the schools	28%
The budget does not meet the needs of our students	26%
I am not pleased with the quality of education	22%

From this data, one can draw a few conclusions; namely, that:

- Providing a quality educational program for students remains important to Guilderland voters. Similar to data from the previous two years, more than four in five "yes" respondents (87%) said they support investing in education, and 45% of the "no" respondents agreed, but said their economic circumstances prevented them from supporting the budget.
- As was the case in each of the last four years, more than two-thirds of the "yes" respondents (69%) are pleased with Guilderland's educational program. In 2018, 22% of "no" respondents said they are not pleased with Guilderland's educational program.

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What were Guilderland voters' best sources of information about the budget?

Survey respondents indicated that their top two budget information sources are the district newsletter and local newspapers, respectively. In last four years, four of the top five sources have come from the district.

Regardless of where respondents got their budget information, a majority approved the budget. Budget approval rates were highest among those respondents who received info at PTA meetings (96%). 11 people who said district Twitter all voted "yes". Respondents who relied on district staff members or SNN for budget information approved the budget at a 91% rate.

Who were the "yes" voters in Guilderland?

In 2018, of the 520 survey respondents who said they voted "yes" on the budget:

- 26% voted at Westmere Elementary School
- 93% said they live in the Town of Guilderland
- 50% said they have lived in the district for more than 20 years
- 37% said they are between the ages of 31 and 50 years old
- 94% said they typically vote "yes" on the budget; 7% said they have not voted in the past
- 39% said they currently have children attending Guilderland schools; of those, 63% have one or more children in grades K-5
- 61% said they do not have children currently attending Guilderland schools; of those, 69% said their children attended Guilderland schools in the past and 45% said their children will attend Guilderland schools in the future
- 67% said the district newsletter was one of the three best sources of budget information, while 35% chose local newspapers and 27% chose the district website
- 95% said they also voted "yes" on the bus and equipment purchase proposition
- 10% said they are district employees

Who were the "no" voters in Guilderland?

In 2018, of the 102 survey respondents who said they voted "no" on the budget:


- 29% voted at Lynnwood Elementary School
- 93% said they live in the Town of Guilderland
- 63% said they have lived in the district for more than 20 years
- 39% said they are between the ages of 51 and 64 years old
- 61% said they typically vote "no" on the budget; 31% said they typically vote "yes"
- 25% said they currently have children attending Guilderland schools; of those, 52% have children in grades 6-8 and/or grades K-5
- 75% said they do not have children currently attending Guilderland schools; of those, 61% said their children attended Guilderland schools in the past and 30% said their children will attend Guilderland schools in the future
- 60% said the district newsletter was their best source of budget information, while 43% chose local newspapers and 24% chose friends/ Family/Neighbors.
- 77% said they also voted "no" on the bus and equipment purchase proposition
- Two people said they are district employees




Q2 In which town do you live?


Q3 How many years have you been a district resident?



Q5 Do you currently have children attending Guilderland schools?



Q6 If yes, what level(s) of school do they attend?



Q7 If no, did your children ever attend Guilderland Schools?



Q8 If no, will your children attend Guilderland Schools when they are older?





Q10 How did you vote on the proposed 2018-19 budget today?



Q11 Why did you vote YES on the proposed 2018-19 budget? (Check all that apply.)




Q12 Why did you vote NO on the proposed 2018-19 budget? (Check all that apply.)


Q13 Of the following communication channels, what were your three best sources of information about the proposed budget? (Please check three only.)








Q2 In which town do you live?



Q3 How many years have you been a district resident?




