FOR STUDENTS IN GRADES 6-8




#### **PARTICIPATION**

All students are expected to make every reasonable effort to engage with presented learning opportunities. Understandably, students may have occasional conflicts in their schedule, but these interruptions should be kept to a minimum just like a normal school day.

Individual teachers will provide clear expectations for students.

### **SCHEDULE**

- A modified schedule of classes with more time allotted in the daily course time windows to allow for flexibility
- Four instructional days (M-TH)
- A/C days are (M & W), B/D days (T, TH)
- Friday is to catch up on assignments and to check in with teachers
- Class engagements are one hour
- Two hours per week for each: ELA, math, science, social studies, and World Language and Culture; 1 hour each per week for all other subject areas
- HS Credit Bearing Courses: 3 hours per week for each



# **CONTENT & RESOURCES**

- A combination of live teaching, recorded lessons, and teacher-designed learning activities
- Teachers will share assignments directly with students
- Condensed curriculum to the most essential concepts
- Special education-related services and ENL instruction will help meet student needs

# COMMUNICATION

It is critical that students make every effort to stay connected with their teachers and to communicate issues as they arise.

- Teachers have office hours throughout the week and will communicate their availability to students
- Outreach to families whose students are not participating regularly
